






Navigation


In your course, look at the menu on the left-hand navigation bar. This is where you will find all the course materials to become familiar with the class.

- Digital camera or camera phone



Course Credit




Coursework is divided into **formative**, or low-stake, assignments meant as a quick check of your student's progress, and **summative**, or high-stake, assignments that that summarize what you have learned in the Module. Course credit is calculated as shown:

- 50% coursework average;
- 50% summative assessment average (for Modules 1-6);
- A passing course grade is 70 or higher.

Final Exam

Students will not have a cumulative final exam in this course. Instead, the Module 6 Test, given in Week 15, will be treated as a final exam. The test will be proctored. You can find more information about online proctoring in your TTU K-12 student handbook.






Course Completion

Students may not complete the course in less than 30 days.


All courses expire six months after the enrollment date.




Answer Keys






