#### **HEPATITIS B SHOTS**

There are 2 levels of risk for individuals who work in laboratory settings with blood exposure.

## Level 1

This individual works in the lab with human or animal blood but <u>does not handle</u> <u>needles</u> (only does flushing, spinning etc.)

# **Hepatitis B Shots Highly Recommended**

You are NOT responsible for the payment of these shots.

## Level 2

This individual is directly susceptible to accidental needle sticks through finger pricks, veni-puncture inserting an in-dwelling catheter, etc.

## **Hepatitis B Shots Required**

If your job requires that you have these shots, the university is responsible for payment according to OSHA standards. These shots are covered under the TTU Occupational Health Program.

- Anyone working with human or animal blood and is exposed to the potential of a needle stick is REQUIRED to have a Hepatitis B Shot. This may be a simple finger prick. ANY and ALL exposure to human or animal blood in relation to a puncture of the skin requires a Hepatitis B Shot.
- If you are working with saliva or urine samples Hepatitis B Shots are not required.
- Texas Tech University Environmental Health and Safety pays for these shots at no cost to yourself under the Occupational Health Program.
- There is a series of 3 shots: First shot- Hepatitis B- wait 30 days-Second shot- Hepatitis B- wait 6 months- Third shot- should be taken within a year
