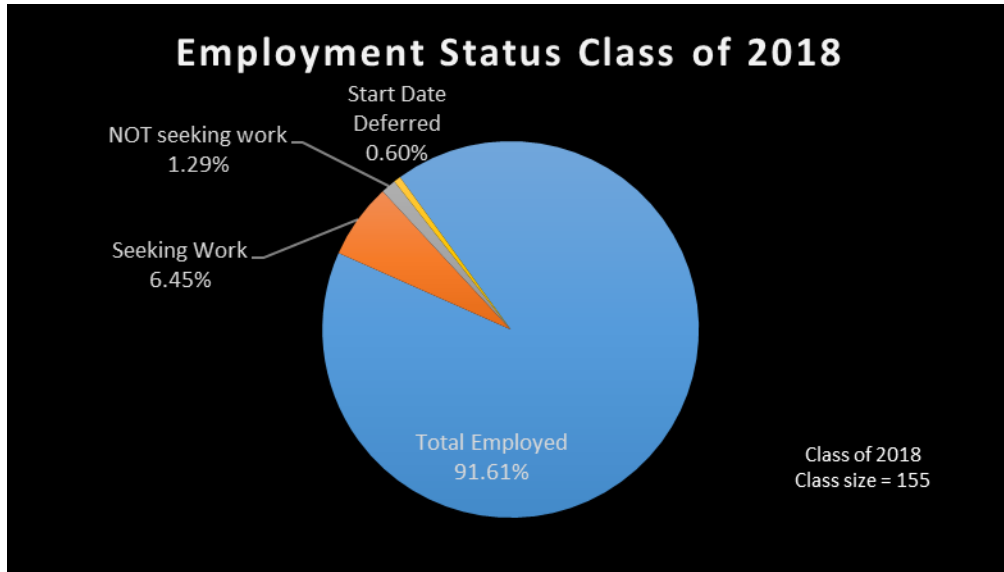

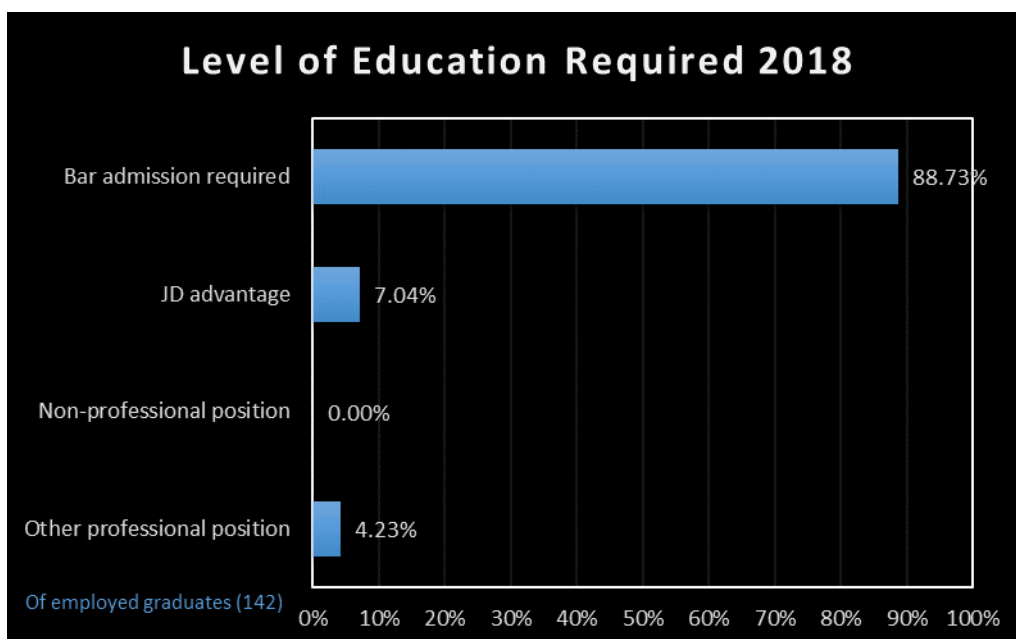

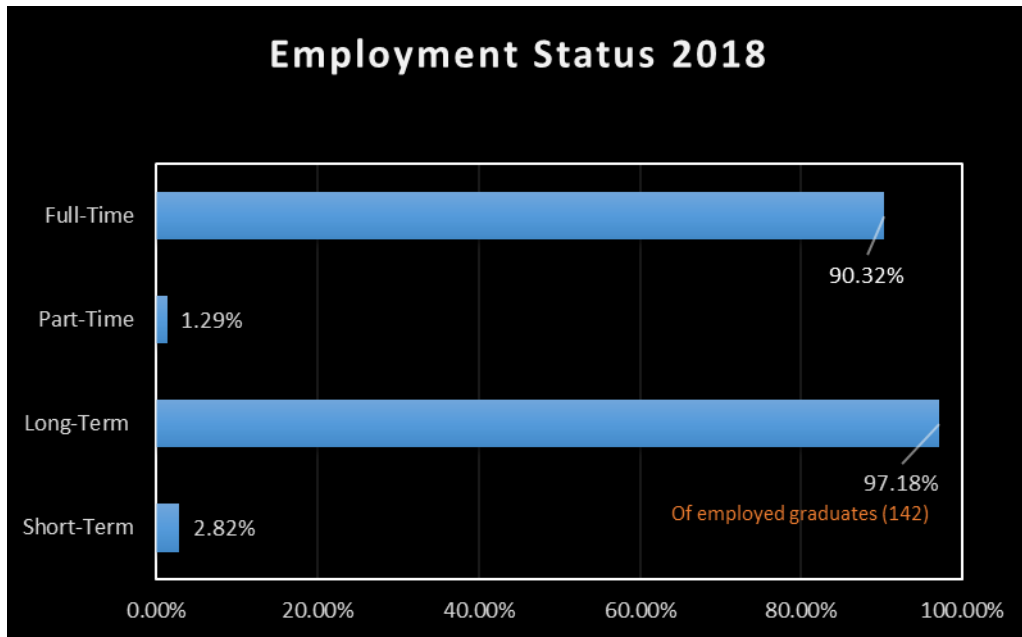
Texas Tech Law Class of 2018 Employment Status ten months after graduation (as of March 15, 2019)



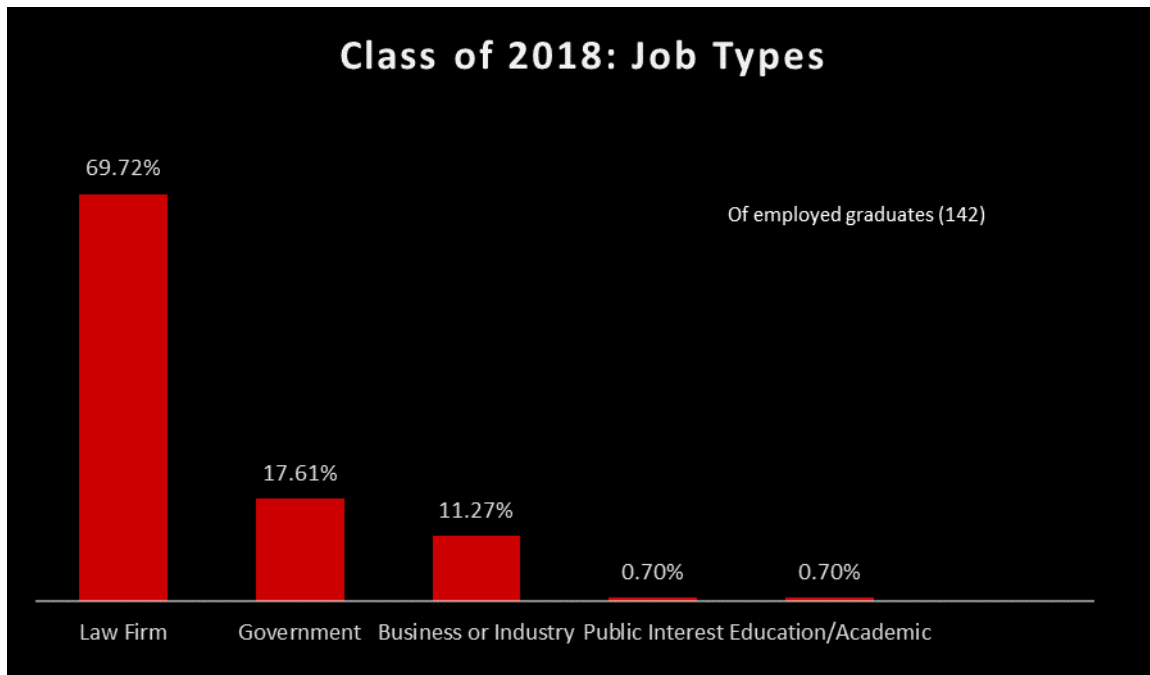
Texas Tech Law Class of 2018 Employment by Education Required

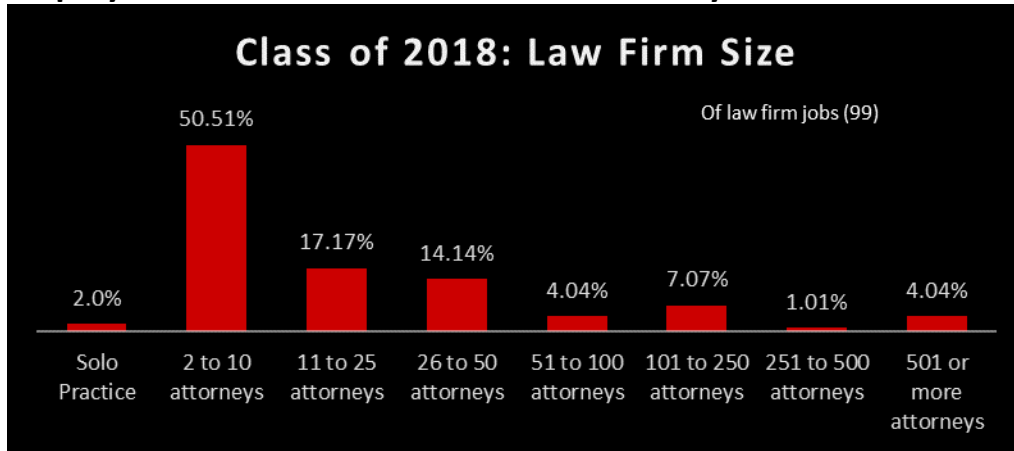

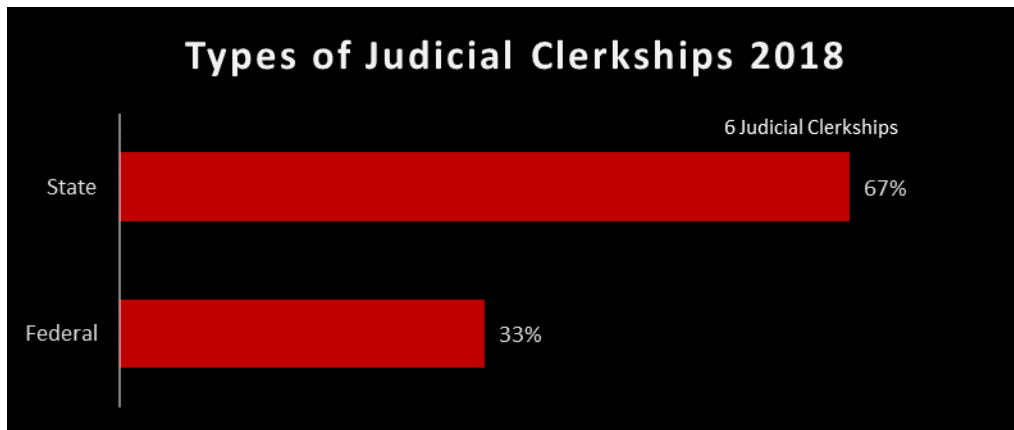

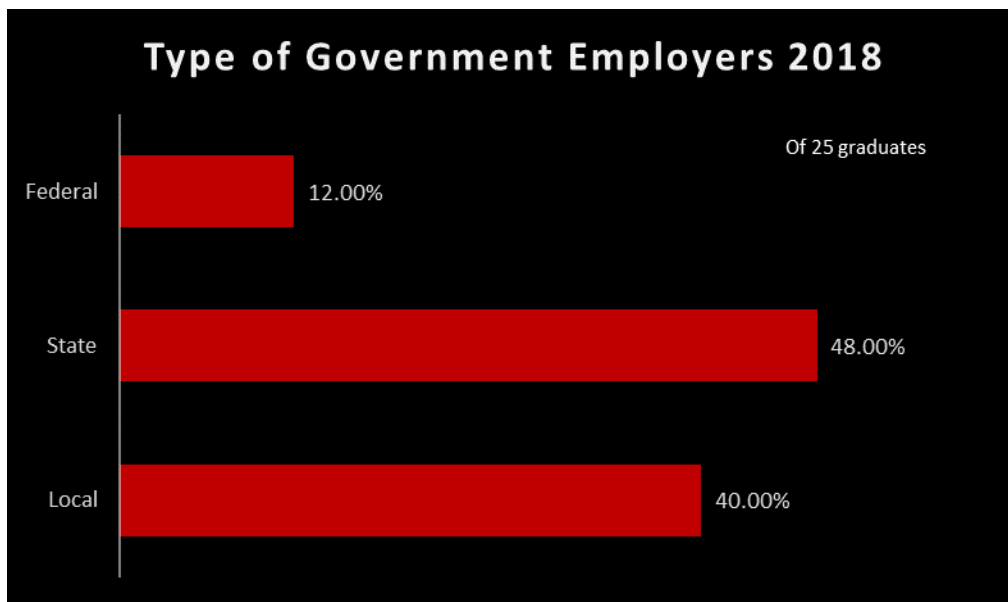

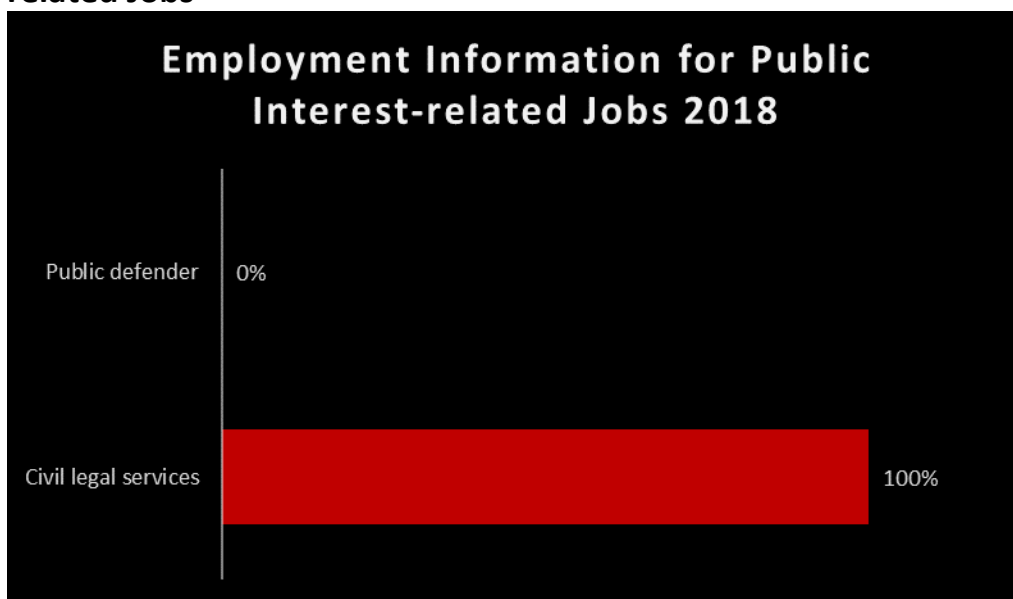
Texas Tech Law Class of 2018 Employment Information for Government Employers (including judicial and military)



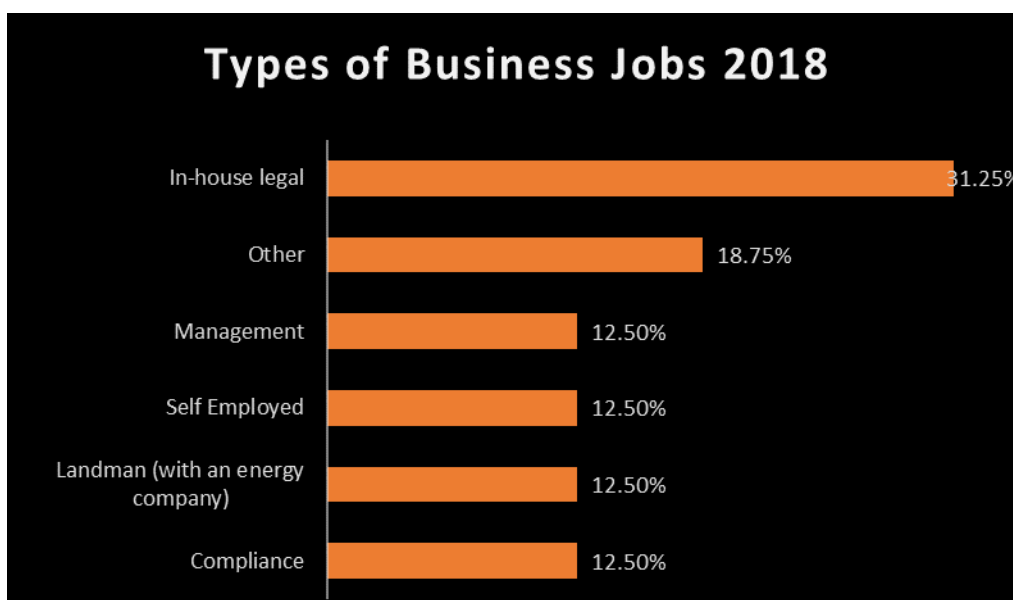
