SECTION OF LITIGATION JUDICIAL INTERN OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM (JIOP)

The American Bar Association Section of Litigation, Litigation will begin accepting applications for its Summer 2017 Judicial Intern Opportunity Program on November 1, 2016. The program is a full-time (32 hours per week), six-week minimum, summer internship program open to all first- or second-year diverse law students. The application process is still open to all law students.

The mission of the Judicial Intern Opportunity Program is to provide opportunities to students who are members of racial and ethnic groups that are traditionally underrepresented in the profession. The program also provides opportunities to students with disabilities, students who are economically disadvantaged, and students who identify themselves as LGBT. Participating judges are from:

- Phoenix, AZ
- California
- New York, NY
- Camden, NJ
- Miami, FL
- Illinois
- Philadelphia, PA
- Texas
- Seattle, WA

Students may indicate geographic location preferences on their applications, but may not request particular judges or courts. Interns will receive an award of \$2,000.

Internships for students with an Intellectual Property Law focus will be offered in Chicago, Los Angeles, Miami, New York, Texas, and Washington, D.C. Students can indicate their interest on their applications. These specialized spots are limited and any student applying to the program with a request for specialization will also be considered for general litigation internships.

SUMMER JUDICIAL INTERN PROGRAM

The Dallas Association of Young Lawyers invites first and second year law students to apply for this summer's DAYL Judicial Intern Program. Judges from Dallas-area civil, criminal, probate, family and appellate courts will be participating.

Internship selections will be made by the participating judges starting in March. Applicants must be willing to commit to a six-week, full-time voluntary internship during the summer months and are expected to honor any commitments made to the judges. The internship is unpaid, and individual schedules will be determined by the judges.

EXTERNSHIP CLASSES

The Externship Class allows students to earn course credit while working under the supervision of a judge or licensed attorney. The externship course includes a classroom component. ABA rules require that the position be unpaid to receive course credit. Dean Alison Myhra administers the externship program. **For more details, please attend one of the informational meetings which typically take place in January and/or February.**

Requirements for the Externship Program

1. 130 hours of unpaid work;
2. Weekly work logs;
3. A paper; and
4. Approximately 6-7 class sessions (or 2-day boot camp).
