

# *The Big 12/Bach Bass Trombone Solo Competition*

The Big 12/Bach Bass Trombone Soloists Competition will be held at the 16th Annual Big 12 Area Trombone Conference at Texas Tech University, January 18 – 20, 2019. The competition is open to all university students who play Bass Trombone.  
**MAXIMUM AGE ON JANUARY 20, 2019– 26 years old.**

**The grand prize will be a \$1,000.00 Gift Certificate towards any Bach, Conn or King Trombone.**

**Up to three finalists will be invited to perform in an Honors Solo Recital, held and adjudicated at the conference.**

**For the Preliminary Round, each candidate is to submit an unedited CD/mp3 recording of the *Canzona # 1 for Bass Solo, Doblinger Edition - G. Frescobaldi***

The chosen work for the final round will be the *Skylines - David Uber - Movements 1 and 2.*

Finalists selected will be expected to provide their own accompanists or use one of the Big 12 Staff Accompanists for a \$60.00 fee. Finalists will also be complimentary guests of the Big 12 Trombone Conference.

If entering by mail, **be sure to clearly identify yourself on the CD jacket, but not on the recording itself.** Please send the CD, along with your name, mailing address, phone, email address, photocopy of your student ID and a check for \$25.00 (checks made payable to “Iota Tau Alpha”) to the mailing address listed below.
