Graduate Assistantship in Collaborative Piano Fall 2025

Stipends between \$10,500 and \$12,000 annually with tuition and select fee waivers.

DUTIES

Duties may include playing in individual vocal/instrumental rehearsals and lessons, performing in juries, recitals and masterclasses, participating in large ensembles and variety of courses, and/or other department responsibilities as needed.

STIPEND FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR

Stipends for Graduate Assistants are available to qualifying Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) and Master of Music (MM) students, to be paid as a salary in monthly installments from October through June. Master's stipend: \$10,500.00; DMA stipend: \$12,000.00. Additional fellowships and scholarships may be available for select students.

TUITION WAIVER AND FEES

Teaching Assistant positions provide significant reductions in all but a portion of tuition and fees, as well as Texas Resident status. Fees vary depending on enrollment.

BENEFITS

In-state tuition and eligibility for medical insurance at a reduced rate.
