DUTIES

Duties may include performing with the Graduate Brass Quintet and Texas Tech University Ensembles, assisting in the trombone studio and/or other administrative and departmental responsibilities.

STIPEND FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR

Stipends for Graduate Assistants are available to qualifying Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) and Master of Music (MM) students, to be paid as a salary in monthly installments from October through June. Master's stipend: \$10,500.00; DMA stipend: \$12,000.00. Additional fellowships and scholarships may be available for select students.

TUITION WAIVER AND FEES

Teaching Assistant positions provide significant reductions in all but a portion of tuition and fees, as well as Texas Resident status. Fees vary depending on enrollment.

In-state tuition and eligibility for medical insurance at a reduced rate.
