Graduate Assistantships Multiple Positions Available Fall 2025

Stipends between \$10,500 and \$13,000 annually with tuition and select fee waivers.



DUTIES

The School of Music has assistantships in various areas and studios each year. Duties can range from administrative assistance, stage crew and performance support, ensemble participation, classroom teaching and support, applied teaching, etc., depending on available openings and the aptitude of graduate applicants. All applicants are automatically considered for graduate assistantships within their programs. Students interested in other assistantship opportunities outside their degree program should contact the School of Music.

STIPEND FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR

Stipends for Graduate Assistants are available to qualifying Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) and Master of Music (MM) students, to be paid as a salary in monthly installments from October through June. Master's stipend: \$10,500.00; DMA stipend: \$12,000.00. Additional fellowships and scholarships may be available for select students.

TUITION WAIVER AND FEES

Teaching Assistant positions provide significant reductions in all but a portion of tuition and fees, as well as Texas Resident status. Fees vary depending on enrollment.

BENEFITS

In-state tuition and eligibility for medical insurance at a reduced rate.

TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY
