DUTIES

Duties may include teaching applied jazz lessons, assisting with jazz history class, directing jazz ensembles, assisting with logistics for rehearsals, concerts, and events, and organizing jazz library.

STIPEND FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR

Stipends for Graduate Assistants are available to qualifying Master of Music (MM) students, to be paid as a salary in monthly installments from October through June. Master's stipend: \$10,500.00. Additional fellowships and scholarships may be available for select students.

TUITION WAIVER AND FEES

Teaching Assistant positions provide significant reductions in all but a portion of tuition and fees, as well as Texas Resident status. Fees vary depending on enrollment.
