MAJOR/ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Contributes to the university's mission through teaching, research and service. Provides teaching as instructional lab support. Under the general supervision of the Director of the School of Music, the Instructor provides support for student degree recitals, juries, rehearsals, and other duties as appropriately assigned.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

1. Ability to provide collaborative piano services for various divisions within the School of Music, covering a blend of student degree recitals, area and studio recitals, masterclasses, juries, and hearings
2. Ability to rehearse jointly with students prior to and in support of performances

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

In addition to the required qualifications, individuals with the following preferred qualifications are strongly encouraged to apply:

1. An earned graduate degree in piano or collaborative piano
2. Excellent interpersonal, communication, and time management skills, as related to scheduling rehearsals and performances with students and other faculty
3. Effective professional ability evidenced by a minimum of one year of experience at the university level accompanying instrumental lessons and recitals
4. Strong sight-reading skills
