SETTING

Present day: a refugee camp on the banks of a river.

PROGRAM - SYNOPSIS

Fleeing their ancestral home, Orfeo and his artist wife, Euridice, cross war-torn lands, poverty-stricken country sides, and a great river in search of safety and security. Upon reaching the shores of their new home, however, the couple is stricken by tragedy as Euridice is pulled back into the river and disappears into the darkness leaving only her sketchbook behind. Orfeo and other refugees mourn her death until, overwhelmed by grief, he sends them away. At the height of his despair, a mysterious stranger appears offering him hope, an enchanted instrument, and armor. The stranger, Amore, explains that the gods have taken pity on Orfeo and will offer him a chance to reclaim his wife from the darkness. But there is a catch – he cannot look at her or explain the situation until their journey home is complete. Despite his trepidation, Orfeo accepts the challenge and heads out to find Euridice.

Returning to a land of desperation, Orfeo reaches a morgue in which Euridice's body is kept. The spirits of those who also died enroute to a new life do not welcome his presence. Orfeo soothes them with music, and they soon allow him to enter Elysium where he marvels at its beauty and serenity. Amore arrives with Euridice, and the couple begins their journey back to safety.

In an attempt to reach the realm of the living, Orfeo pulls Euridice through the darkness. Exhausted and confused, Euridice begs for Orfeo to comfort her. Orfeo, remembering the rules laid out by the gods, refuses, sending Euridice spiraling into despair. Growing more and more despondent, Euridice's cries weaken Orfeo. He takes her in his arms, and, as Amore had warned, she dies. Overwhelmed by grief and unsure if he can go on without her, Orfeo resolves to kill himself. Amore steps in, and, again taking pity on Orfeo, brings Euridice back to life.
