PERFORMER BIOS

Lanfranco Marcelletti Jr., conductor

The Brazilian-born conductor, professor, and pianist Lanfranco Marcelletti, Jr. has been recognized by critics and audiences for his important work in music. His engagements as a conductor have brought him to most countries in Europe, North, and South America. In the opera world, he has collaborated with the Rossini Opera Festival (Pesaro, Italy), the Glimmerglass Opera Festival (Cooperstown, NY), Commonwealth Opera (Massachusetts, USA), Teatro Calderón (Valladolid, Spain), and Albany University (USA). Among his prizes, we can cite the first prize in both the II Conducting International Competition, organized by the Chilean Symphony Orchestra, and the Giovani Solisti di Roma Competition in piano. Marcelletti attended Yale University (orchestra conducting), the Hochschule für Musik und darstellende Kunst in Vienna (piano, composition), the Musik Akademie in Zurich (piano) and the Conservatório Pernambucano de Música (Recife, Brazil), where he started his music studies. He held the positions of music director of the Cayuga Chamber Orchestra (USA), and Xalapa and Aguascalientes Symphonies (Mexico). Currently, he is the Director of Orchestral Studies at the Texas Tech University School of Music and the Artistic Director of the Recife Symphony Orchestra.

Ibis Laurel, conductor

Born in Mexico, Ibis Laurel is trying to establish herself in the Mexican orchestral conducting scene; particularly in Tijuana, Baja California, where she lived before moving to Lubbock.

She holds a bachelor's degree in music education from the University of Veracruz, and a master's degree in choral conducting from San Diego State University where she was a Fulbright scholar.

She has participated several times at the Conductor's Retreat at Medomak, ME, a summer workshop for orchestral conductors, founded and directed by Maestro Kenneth Kiesler.

As a conductor, Ibis Laurel was awarded a Mexican federal grant with which she founded the Camerata XXXI –an early vocal music/instrumental groupto record an album with music from the Colonial Americas, particularly from the New Spain (Southwest USA, Mexico, Guatemala, and Cuba) entitled "Florilegium Novohispanum: a musical journey from California to Guatemala". In 2023, she obtained another federal grant for performing artists, which allowed her to found the Chimæra Ensemble, a string chamber orchestra that brings together young talented freelance musicians for whom music may or may not be their main profession. The Tijuana-based Chimæra Ensemble mainly specializes in lesser-known works from the traditional orchestral repertoire, mainly music from Latin America, of which Ibis is very fond of the rhythmic richness. They debuted in May 2024 at the U.U. Church in San Diego, CA. and in Tijuana, Baja California.

Currently, Ibis is in her first year of the master's in orchestral conducting at TTU, studying under the tutelage of Lanfranco Marcelletti. In addition to her conducting studies, she holds a degree in English/Spanish interpretation and translation.

PROGRAM NOTES

In July 2013, Dr. Mark Morton travelled to Parma, Italy to photograph the Bottesini manuscripts of the Concerto No. 1 housed in the Biblioteca Palatina, Sezione Musicale, Parma Conservatory. From these manuscripts, Dr. Morton reconstructed Bottesini's original orchestration of this work. While editorial decision were made to create a practical performing edition, he remained as faithful to the original as possible.
