

Entrance Requirements:

1. Apply to the Texas Tech University Graduate School here: https://ttugradschool.force.com/admissions/ApplicationLogin

Required items and submissions include:

- Transcripts: A 4-year undergraduate degree in a music are and at least 30 hours from an earned master's degree in music. Copies of transcripts are required for application evaluation purposes.
- TOEFL scores: Scores for the Test of English as a Foreign Language must be included with your application if you are an international student. An iBT (Internet-based test) TOEFL score of 79 or above is required for international applicants. - Supporting materials: an example of scholarly writing on a music topic and a statement of purpose
- If admitted, you will be required to submit official transcripts, diplomas/degree certificates, and test scores. Please do not send official transcripts until you have received a notice of acceptance from Texas Tech Graduate School.

2. Submit Recordings or Attend a Live Audition

- Auditions may include screening for Teaching Assistantship positions

According to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, students may not hold two similar degrees from the same institution. Therefore, students who hold a Doctor of Musical Arts degree of any kind from Texas Tech will not be admitted for an additional Doctor of Musical Arts. The same restriction holds for the Master of Music, Master of Music Education, the Doctor of Musical Arts, the Doctor of Philosophy in Music Education, and the Doctor of Philosophy in Fine Arts.

Information about these examinations will be sent to admitted students prior to the start of term. Depending on results of these exams, MUHL 5300, MUTH 5300 and/or MUTH 5301 may be required as leveling courses. Those courses may not be applied toward the required credits of this degree.

Other Degree Requirements

Qualifying Examinations

Doctoral Performance and Pedagogy Projects

For DMA Piano Pedagogy majors, either the solo recital or the collaborative recital may be presented first and counted as the qualifying recital. Normally, this recital will take place in the first or second semester after acceptance into the program. The student must pass the qualifying recital with a grade of B- or better; otherwise, he or she will not be allowed to continue in the chosen program of study. An applicant who fails to pass the qualifying recital with a grade of B- or better may, with the permission of the student's recital committee, be allowed only one opportunity to replay the recital in the following semester. The qualifying recital must be completed by the third semester following acceptance into the degree. Following the presentation of the qualifying recital, subsequent doctoral performance projects may be completed in any order. It is highly encouraged that at least one of the recitals or presentations be prepared under the supervision of a second member of the piano faculty. Concerto repertoire may be included on the solo or collaborative recitals.

It is customary for the two Pedagogy Projects to represent each one of the following: (1) a lecture- Recital with significant performance component, and (2) a workshop on a pedagogical topic such as one might present to a teachers' organization. The formats remain flexible, however, and different decisions may be made in individual instances.

The final project must be accompanied by a substantial document of high scholarly quality (DMA Document), as advised by the student's major professor and advisory committee. At least one project must include a substantial 20th-21st Century work. The faculty must approve of all projects in advance.

Graduate Certificates (Optional)

Graduate Certificates at Texas Tech are credentialing courses of study of approximately 15 credit hours that students may pursue simultaneously with regular graduate degrees, or as stand-alone programs.
