What is Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI)?

OLLI began as a continuing education program at Texas Tech University in 2002-2003 as Texas Tech Lifelong Learning. In 2008, endowment support was received from the Bernard Osher Foundation. In recognition of its affiliation with the Osher Foundation and as one of 117 such institutes nationwide, Texas Tech Lifelong Learning was re-named Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at Texas Tech University. We are self-sustaining, supported through membership dues, class fees, an endowment from the Bernard Osher Foundation, donations and in-kind support from Texas Tech University. *No tests, no grades, no research papers – Just intellectual stimulation.*

What are the requirements to join?

Everyone age 50 and older may join.
The only prerequisite is a desire to learn.

What does membership cost?

Membership is \$30 per person, valid from September to July, and does not include cost of individual courses.

Who teaches OLLI classes?

Most of our classes are taught by distinguished professors, both active and retired. Other instructors are experts in their fields, university doctoral students or OLLI members. There is one common denominator: they teach because they enjoy education and OLLI students.

How do I sign up?

Below are the methods to register for memberships, classes and other events:

- Get a 3% discount if you pay online! Using a credit card, register online through our website www.oli.ttu.edu. We accept VISA, MasterCard, and Discover.
- Memberships or classes with food, transportation or supplies are not eligible for the discount.
- Mail registration form in catalog or printed from OLLI website www.oli.ttu.edu with a check to OLLI, TTU Higher Education Teaching Site at Fredericksburg, 2818 East U.S. Hwy 290, Fredericksburg, TX 78624.
- Bring completed form with check to the OLLI office in Fredericksburg on Monday-Thursday noon - 5 p.m.

What if I have to cancel my registration?

(Applies to members and non-members)

You must submit your cancellation in writing or by email **NO LATER THAN THE SEVENTH DAY BEFORE THE FIRST SESSION OF A CLASS**. We ask that you accept a credit towards the fee for another class or event in same semester, but if a refund is preferred, one will be applied to the credit card used to register for canceled class. No cancellations or credits are allowed for any classes with bus transportation, food, or supplies. You may allow a substitute for your spot. If you pay online with a credit card, a refund is applied to same card in 2-3 weeks. If you pay by check, a refund can take 60-90 days to process.

What happens for weather or other emergency cancellations?

In case of questionable weather call 830.990.4948 and ask for OLLI to confirm if class has been canceled. OLLI reserves the right to substitute instructors, rearrange class schedules, or cancel classes because of low enrollment or other reasons. In case of class cancellation or a schedule change, you will be notified and may receive a credit for another class in the same semester or a refund.

The Three Chapters of the Beatles

Some Interesting Aspects of Hill Country Area Geology

Very few (if any) places in the United States can claim a geological past as interesting as the area within a triangle from Fredericksburg to Llano to Austin. This area has experienced it all! Earthquakes, volcanoes, great mountain ranges, enormous seas and cave formation are geological processes that have left their evidence in this area if we only look around.

This lecture will examine the geological history of this area by focusing on the uplift of the Edwards Plateau, the Enchanted Rock area, Longhorn Caverns and the Balcones Fault along with Pilot Knob, McKinney Falls, and the evidence left by the great Cretaceous Inland Seaway. So, let's all be geologists for a while and take a virtual field trip to study the great geology of this most interesting area!

Geology. From 1999-2004 she served as the Associate Dean of the School of Natural, Applied Sciences and Mathematics. Dr. Sage is retired and is giving seminars and lectures on various geology subjects.

"We'll always have Paris," Elsa says to Rick in *Casablanca*, and generations of artists, writers, composers and dancers have felt exactly the same way. Some say it's the history, and some say it's the light – but we think it just might be the food. 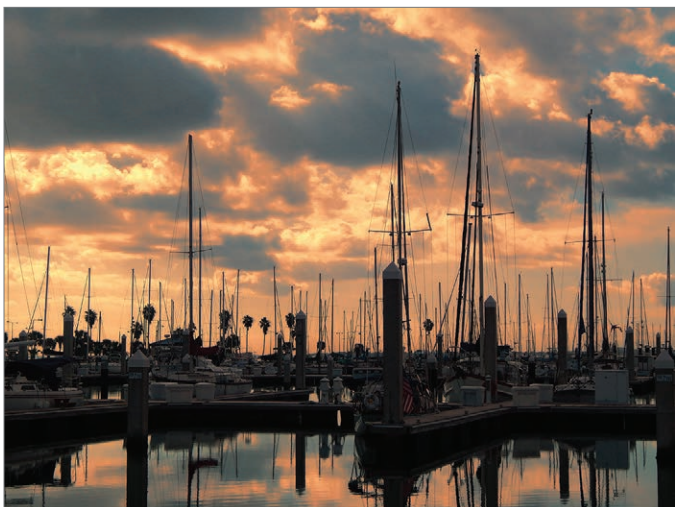

Galveston – Pirates, Powerbrokers & Preservationists (Session One)

Galveston has a long and storied history! From the days when it hosted Jean Lafitte and the largest slave market in the New World, to the arrival of the powerful who directed the “Wall Street of the Southwest,” Galveston has molded the Texas story. Refusing to let the city die after the worst natural disaster in U.S. history, led to an engineering feat – a 17-foot seawall rose from the beach and the level of the island was lifted behind that barrier. After years of dominating the world of vice, the city discovered its Victorian beauty and rebounded as an oasis of 19th Century charm. After Hurricane Ike destroyed the hundred year-old oaks, the twisted trunks were sculpted into figures of art. The Phoenix continues to rise from the ashes.

Wave of German Migration (Session Two)

Friedrich Ernst, who is still called the “Father of German Immigration,” wrote such glowing letters about his new home in Texas, that Germans began arriving in small groups. Then, twenty-one German nobleman hoping to make a fortune by sending settlers to the cheap land in Texas, began a poorly-planned immigration program that led thousands of settlers – many to their death – to the barren shore of Matagorda Bay. Many remained on the coast and began a community that grew into the thriving seaport of Indianola. The first wave that continued inland established New Braunfels in 1845 and then moved on the following year to begin Fredericksburg. German immigrants spread out across Texas coloring the landscape with handwork and success.

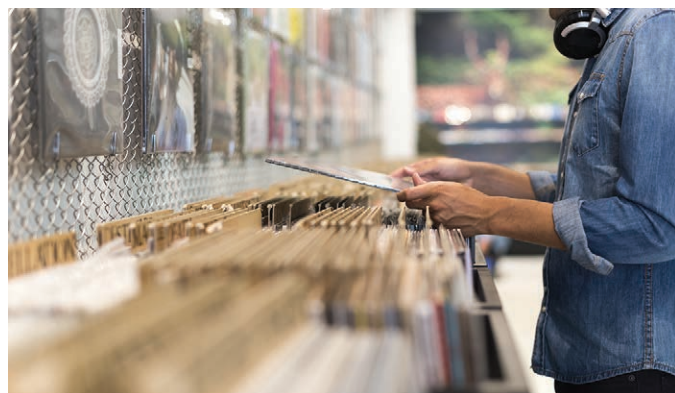

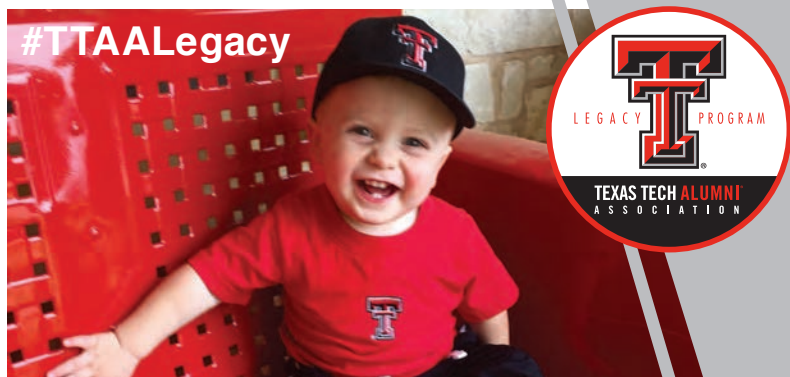
