The Office of Planning and Assessment reports its weekly activities and contributions toward Texas Tech University's institutional effectiveness efforts and departmental objectives.


OUTCOME 1: Texas Tech will be found in compliance with all external accrediting agencies and State of Texas mandates

- → Based on a meeting held May 24, the Office of Planning and Assessment will be working collaboratively with the Office of the Provost and Application and Development to develop technology solutions for improving the existing faculty credentialing process. Currently, all instructors of record must have official transcripts on file with the Office of the Provost. OPA is currently developing a password-protected procedure for storing electronic transcripts in DigitalMeasures. In addition, OPA will take the following actions:
 - OPA will develop educational materials and schedule refresher credentialing meetings with departmental contacts
 - A database/ application solution will be explored

OUTCOME 3: The Office of Planning and Assessment will continually monitor the university's compliance with laws, policy statements, and policies deriving from the State of Texas, THECB, and SACSCOC

→ THECB

This week, the THECB provided findings from a longitudinal, 11-year study that investigated attainment of higher education degrees or certifications for Texas 8th graders enrolled in 2005. The statewide summary and Lubbock County statistics are found in the chart below. Any outliers with 9 percentage points or more are highlighted. Overall, 20% of Lubbock students obtained higher education degrees or certificates through the end of 2016.

OUTCOME 4: Texas Tech University faculty and staff will be well-prepared to meet OPA's faculty credentialing, assessment, and strategic plan expectations

→ The Office of Planning and Assessment is meeting regularly with the College of Education to offer support in developing an assessment plan that aligns college level initiatives and priorities with institutional requirements. These meetings are focused on streamlining assessment processes for program level coordinators. In addition to meetings with program coordinators, OPA has met with a broader COE group that manages college level databases and dashboards. In our most recent meeting this week, program assessment plans within the college's assessment activities were discussed. Based on the results from this meeting, we are currently identifying a better way to integrate college level and program level outcomes that align with institutional reporting. Based on our discussions, presenting information to PC's that entails the correct wording (definitions and how they relate to the COE processes -P1, P2, P3, Trademark Outcomes, etc.) will be beneficial. Defining the Degree Program Assessment Process with the terms/phrases that COE uses in their college's assessment activities will make data needs more succinct and clear.

In addition to direct contributions toward the departmental goals, OPA continues to focus on continuous improvement measures.

- This spring, OPA partnered with IR to share access to IR's Qualtrics license. This provided OPA with ownership of the Online Senior Assessment, but also allowed for OPA to create more sophisticated survey instruments for internal purposes. Since receiving access, OPA has created 5 surveys in Qualtrics for various purposes, ranging from SSL and Degree Program Continuous Improvement, WTAC Conference Interest, and Study Abroad Orientation registration. Qualtrics is a more user friendly survey platform than REDCap and allows for greater variation in survey functionality. For example, Qualtrics was able to apply quotas to Study Abroad Orientation dates which would close a specific date for registration once the quota was met. Qualtrics also allows for greater personalization of survey appearance and more intuitive branching logic. OPA plans to fully transition currently in-use OPA surveys from REDCap to Qualtrics by September.
