Reaffirmation Update

This week, OPA staff met with Pradip Sahu in Institutional Research to discuss data needs for the upcoming 2025 SACSCOC Reaffirmation of Accreditation. The following data for CR 6.1 (Full-time faculty) will be formally requested in early Fall 2022: faculty workload, faculty FT/PT counts, course data and full-time/part-time faculty status, and SCH. For Standard 6.2.b (Program faculty), this data will be requested: FT/PT faculty by program, FT/PT SCH generated by program, peer institution benchmarks, faculty characteristics based on location and modality.
