



Up next in the queue is the School of Veterinary Medicine, Rawls College of Business, and the Costa Rica campus.


Kara is in the process of completing the PAR reports for the College of Arts & Sciences, the College of Architecture, and the College of Visual and Performing Arts.

TechQuest Report

OPA continues to work on the 2021-2022 TechQuest report. In total, 17,226 students were invited to participate, and **we collected 1,644 responses**. The report will have total scores and averages, but also analysis on each of the 8 academic areas that correspond to the Core Curriculum FCAs. We expect the report to be completed by late summer 2022.


Below are results from the 701 responses from **first-year students**, including a graph showing the distribution of scores:

Core Curriculum Report

Our office continues to work on the 2021-2022 Core Curriculum report, finishing the results sections for both Core Curriculum and TechQuest data. We received 861 responses for the academic year and 105,946 data points, 13,622 more data points (a 13% increase), from 2020-2021. This increase is hopefully due to our attempts at following up with instructors, improving the data collection process, and revising incorrect data submissions. We are working on creating a Z-score for the Core and Multicultural Curriculum, TechQuest, NSSE, and the ETS Proficiency Profile, in order to provide a clearer overall score for all the assessments on which we collect data. This should help readers identify assessment outcomes easily across all assessments without needing extensive knowledge on each assessment and their unique scores and analysis. We expect to complete the final report by early fall 2022.

Window Leaks and Repair

This Spring, we experienced some minor to significant leakage via the windows of our suite along the exterior/west side of our building. This was not a new issue but a recurring issue. Operations attempted to remedy the situation by applying silicone edging to the lower panes on the interior. When Operations came back to inspect their work, it was determined that though the leaks were much improved, there were still varying degrees of leaks in every single window along the exterior wall. Based on this evidence, Operations determined that they would escalate the remedy. They contracted with a local roofing company to address the situation by sealing all the windows on the exterior. They used a crane to accomplish their goal. I'm sorry I didn't get a picture of them on the equipment! Since the windows are only single-paned, it was interesting to be able to hear the workers while they were making the repairs. We hope that this will address the leaks—especially with the prospect of new carpet getting installed.

Carpet Replacement Progress

After some initial estimates and design decisions from April and May, we are getting closer to the installation of new carpets in the OPA Suite! The proposal was received by Operations on June 6th. I submitted the requisition that completed workflow into a purchase order on June 7th. After Libby approved the funding request, the purchase order completed workflow on June 10th. Once our order is received, it will be made up in seven to ten business days. The installation will then take place within the following two to three weeks.
