Texas Penal Code Section 46.035(c) states: "A license holder commits an offense if the license holder intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly carries a handgun under the authority of Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, regardless of whether the handgun is concealed or carried in a shoulder or belt holster, in the room or rooms where a meeting of a governmental entity is held and if the meeting is an open meeting subject to Chapter 551, Government Code, and the entity provided notice as required by that chapter," Thus, no person can carry a handgun and enter the room or rooms where a meeting of the THECB is held if the meeting is an open meeting subject to Chapter 551, Government Code.
Please Note that this governmental meeting is, in the opinion of counsel representing THECB, an open meeting subject to Chapter 551, Government Code and THECB is providing notice of this meeting as required by Chapter 551. In addition, please note that the written communication required by Texas Penal Code Sections 30.06 and 30.07, prohibiting both concealed and open carry of handguns by Government Code Chapter 411 licensees, will be posted at the entrances to this governmental meeting.

OPA Prepared Documentation for 14.1

 Hughes and Morton met on Wednesday, July 17 to discuss our office's internal plans for compliance with 14.1. We drafted a document for Dr. James' signature that describes Texas Tech "in identical terms" to our respective USDOE accreditors. We will send this document to our accreditors on September 1, 2019.

student assistant, Julie Gee, for bringing her creative expertise to this project.



Summer II House Bill 2504 Compliance

- The deadline for Texas House Bill 2504 is 18 July 2019. At this time, TTU is at about 70% compliant. After an initial email to all faculty, we have already seen more syllabi uploaded and will have weekly updates. For further reading about HB 2504, you can read the full bill here:

- Even after our first blast, we have seen a lot of responses for those who forgot, had issues uploading, or wanted additional help with DigitalMeasures or the syllabus requirement. Upcoming Changes to DigitalMeasures:

- As we continue to update and find more efficient ways to manage data in DigitalMeasures, we have found a number of screens to alter, particularly in how DM stores faculty productivity information, P&T procedures, and intellectual property. Some changes are pending and others are still in planning stages.
- Upcoming changes to Outreach and Engagement will hopefully create a more robust system for reporting O&E in DigitalMeasures. We hope these changes will capture some items that go unreported and be a better representation of the engagement efforts of TTU faculty and staff.

QEP Impact Report

- OPA spent significant time this week conducting data analysis for the Study Abroad Pre-Departure
 Assessment. Hughes completed an initial round of qualitative coding, and shared emergent themes
 with Drs. Pare and Vasseur at a meeting on July 16. A follow-up meeting to discuss final themes is
 scheduled for Thursday, July 25.
- Ashley Pruitt analyzed the resulting survey data a second time, after a follow-up data request from Drs.
