- DigitalMeasures Faculty List for all faculty teaching graduate courses
- DigitalMeasures Publications and Presentations List for all faculty teaching graduate courses

I have asked our graduate faculty to update their publications and presentations on Digital Measures by July 31, 2020. I also might add that all of our assessment data for fall and spring semesters of the 2019-2020 academic year have been submitted through Nuventive Improve.



HB2504 Summer II Compliance

- This Summer's final HB2504 compliance was 99.3%, with only a handful of remaining incomplete syllabi. The graphic below shows our compliance over time.
- This term was different in how we contacted departments as we look for optimal communication. This term we requested deans and chairs to distribute a walkthrough and informational flyer about HB2504 to their departments and then OPA followed up with individual instructors. Additional contact went only to instructors missing syllabi before contacting the department chair with instructors cc'd in the email message to the chair.


Texas Tech University faculty and staff will be well-prepared to meet OPA's faculty credentialing, assessment, and strategic plan expectations.
