Candidates improve student engagement during the year-long practicum.

Assessment Methods

Survey - Student - Student Perception Survey (formerly called Classroom Engagement Inventory).

Students state how much they agree with a statement on a 4-point scale (Never, Some of the time, Most of the time, always). The four focus areas in this survey area: Student Learning, Student-Centered, Environment, Classroom Community, and Classroom Management.

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(Active)

Criterion: Students' scores on the Classroom Engagement Inventory will increase from pretest to posttest during the year-long practicum.
