

### Title IX, Sexual Misconduct & Clery Act






### What is Title IX?

"No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

Title IX of the Higher Education Amendments of 1972 20 U.S.C. § 1681 & 34 C.F.R. Part 106



# U.S. Department of Education Protections for Pregnant, Nursing & Parenting Students

#### **Universities Must**

Excuse absences due to pregnancy or childbirth for as long as a doctor says it is necessary

Allow students to return to the same academic and extracurricular status as before medical leave began, which should include giving the opportunity to make up any work missed while the student was out

Provide pregnant students with the same special services it provides to students with temporary medical conditions. This includes homebound instruction/at-home tutoring/independent study

You are not mandated to report pregnancy, however, you can file on behalf of the student or provide information on how to report so that the student may access supportive measures.



### What Happens When a Report is Filed?

Title IX Case Management Team reviews report

Sends student email to provide Supportive Measures and discuss resolution options

Student decides if they would like to file a Formal Complaint to participate in the Formal Grievance Process

Informal Resolution

Pursue Investigation for Potential Disciplinary Action

# Texas Tech University: The Clery Act



## WHAT IS THE CLERY ACT?



- In 1986, Jeanne Clery was brutally beaten, raped, and murdered in her residence hall
- Her parents believed the University failed to share vital campus safety information and campaigned for legislative reform
- Sustained efforts led to the passage of the Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act
- Includes compliance within Title IX, VAWA, Stop Campus Hazing Act, and Drug Free Schools and Community Act

## Clery Act Compliance

The purpose of the Clery Act is to provide the campus community with timely, accurate, and complete information about crime and the safety of campus so that they can make informed decisions to keep themselves safe.

## Clery Specific Geography

## It does not matter WHO the victim is or WHEN it occurred, it's the WHERE:



## Clery Campus Notifications-Timely Warnings

A Timely Warning Notification will be sent out to the <u>entire campus community</u> if the crime is considered by the institution to <u>represent a serious or continuing threat</u> to students and employees

► The goal is to prevent similar crimes from taking place

## Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA)

On December 23, 2024, the *Stop Campus Hazing Act* was signed, which amended the Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act.

SCHA requires institutions of higher education participating in federal student aid programs to track and report hazing incidents to the public.

## Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA)

- Hazing is not just physical abuse
  - **Violent hazing** is the most easily recognized form of hazing, but happens less frequently that **intimidation hazing** (examples: social isolation, deception, demerits, etc.) and **harassment hazing** (examples: verbal abuse, threats, sleep deprivation, etc.)
- All forms of hazing can result in **Hidden Harm**: the mental and emotional scars that result from being hazed and even from hazing others. Hazing can be the trigger that pushes someone past their breaking point regardless of whether they have an underlying mental disorder. **You don't know what might break someone.**
- Hazing can happen to anyone, and can happen in any organization in which there
  is a hierarchy, including academic clubs, fraternities and sororities, marching bands,
  and athletic teams.
- You can't consent to hazing. Hazers know what will happen and hide information from new members. Those being hazed are blind to the actual risks and can't give informed consent.
- Listen to your gut feeling. If you think an activity is problematic, find a way to speak up. If it's an emergency, call 911.
