Texas Tech University, the department of political science invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level, beginning in Fall 2018. We seek candidates with broad training in International Relations. Although applicants from all International Relations subfield are encouraged to apply, we are especially interested in candidates who conduct research and teach in the areas of international organizations, institutions and cooperation, broadly defined.

Applicants must show evidence and/or promise of excellence in teaching and an active research agenda. Candidates with strong quantitative and formal methods training, and an ability to teach graduate methods courses, are preferred. Candidates who have very strong records of scholarship supported by extramural funding and who have the proven capacity or clear potential to bring externally sponsored research to Texas Tech University are encouraged to apply. A Ph.D. in political science is required by the time of the appointment.

Applicants should submit a cover letter, curriculum vitae, writing sample, three letters of reference, and evidence of teaching effectiveness.
