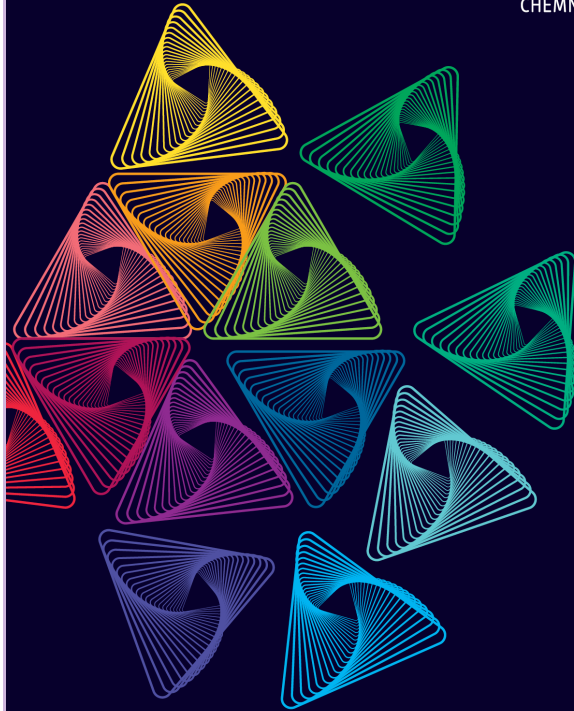

Panel Kulturwissenschaft (Science of Culture):

Images as Agents of Cultural Transformation

The approach to images as cultural documents of collective memory and instruments of social shaping build a central theoretical component of cultural theories since its establishment as a critical discipline. Prominent thinkers of cultural studies and art history defined images as symbolic representations and as carriers and storages of affective, cultural expression. This broad understanding of images as carriers of archival value, texts, and complex language also found its popularity within the semiotic structuralist and poststructuralist tradition. Nearly most of the leading figures of both streams have contributed fundamentally to advancing a new image-based semiotic study of culture that revolutionized humanities, encouraging dismantling boundaries between disciplines and flattening hierarchical cultural structures.

The panel Culture Studies titled „Images as Agents of Cultural Transformation” follows this tradition and revisits theories of images as signs and sign processes that shape our perception and reality. Its main goal is to elaborate on the fundamental role of images as a driving force of cultural evolution.

Topics of discussion include sign processes as carriers of cultural changes and how these processes determine the interrelation of image components. Furthermore, the panel addresses the role of images as tools of cultural shaping and as reasoning vehicles within the network of cultural memory.

As complex signs, images evolve in multimodal expressive forms. The panel hosts compelling examples of cultural and social shaping by images in literature, film, photography, and aesthetic education. It expands the theoretical reflection to abstract concepts of visual perception from biological patterns to digital algorithms and ideological theories. They all derive from the deep archive of cultural experience and reshape our relation to reality.
