

Charles S. Peirce Interdisciplinary Graduate Fellowship



Deadline: 10/15/2026

Awarded for Spring 2027

General Conditions:

- Candidates must have completed at least one year of their doctoral program before the proposed fellowship begins.
- In an emergency, candidates must show a clear case for their absence noted in their application and stating any modification of the general rule (for example: maternity or paternity leave or illness resulting in a career break).
- All Fellows are expected to carry out original research on the topic for which they have been registered as graduates.
- Fellows are expected to participate actively in the intellectual life of the Institute and to share their knowledge with the Institute.
- Fellows are required to present a written report at the conclusion of their appointment.
- A fellowship may be terminated if the Institute's Selection Committee is not satisfied that the conditions of the award are being met.

All publications containing results of work carried out with the aid of the Institute for Studies in Pragmatism shall include full acknowledgement of the fact. Fellows are expected to provide a copy for the Institute of any publications arising from this work.

Value of the Fellowship

The fellowship provides financial support towards living, study, and subsistence costs of up to \$5,000 academic year. The duration and timing of tenure will be agreed with the Institute.

How to apply

Complete applications must include the following:

- An application letter of intent
- A recommendation letter by the candidate's advisor
 - The advisor's letter should include:
 - A statement describing the originality and significance of the proposed research to the applicant's field.
 - How well the candidate's research contributes to interdisciplinary research.
- A curriculum vitae
 - Giving full details of name, address (including e-mail address), present occupation, school and university education, degrees. Please ensure that you include the start and end dates for all positions/scholarships/study periods/funding previously or currently held.
- A description of your research project including:
 - An abstract of not more than 150 words outlining the significance of your research project.
 - A detailed description of your research project (no more than 800 words) including the title of your research project and the outputs you intend to complete.
 - An explanation of not more than 300 words outlining the interdisciplinary character of your approach.
 - A description of the planned contribution you will make to the intellectual life of the Institute.
- A financial plan for the requested funding.
