GENERAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE Minutes November 19, 2003

The General Education Committee met on Wednesday, November 19, 2003, from Noon to 1 p.m. in the Provost's Conference Room.

- 1. Minutes for the meeting on 10/19/2003. Minutes were approved by consensus.
- 2. <u>Core Assessment instrument discussion</u>. The "Academic Achievement Orientation Instrument" was presented and discussed, briefly, in the October 15 meeting. The topic was revisited with reflection today. The sense of the discussion was as follows: Reich and Austin impressed the committee with their presentation of an obviously well-designed instrument. Concerns were expressed with respect to the results of that instrument being appropriate for meeting the requirements posed by the state. The instrument appears to be a predictor of student success while the state is attempting to assess outcomes. This appears to be a fundamental mismatch.
- 3. <u>Transfer Issues.</u> Bolch brought an item to the committee from her department regarding transfer credit given for Core courses. Specifically a transfer course "Biblical Foundations for Living" presented for satisfying the humanities <u>and</u> the multicultural categories' requirements. The committee felt that what appears to be a theology course does not satisfy the humanities requirement manifestly and does not satisfy the multicultural requirement because it does not compare and contrast cultures or present a non-mainstream cultural perspective.
- 4. <u>Subsequent meetings</u> are to be on January 21, February 18, March 24, and April 21.
