VERONICA BULLOCK SHARES INSIGHTS ON MEASURING PARTNERSHIP EFFECTIVENESS

The Office of Outreach & Engagement hosted Veronica Bullock from Purdue University on June 26 as she presented on how the Wilder Collaboration Factors Inventory (WCFI) can be a powerful tool for evaluating the health and effectiveness of collaborative partnerships.

WCFI allows faculty to build strong partnerships and publish their approach early in their engagement careers. This directly addresses the concern many faculty have about the time to publish engaged scholarship. Catch the replay of the presentation here.

TEXAS TECH AND LISD PARTNERS SHARE INSIGHTS ON COLLABORATIVE SCHOLARSHIP

Mellinee Lesley, Ph.D., associate vice provost for community-engaged learning, along with community partners from the Lubbock Independent School District and doctoral students from the College of Education, published an article in the "Journal of Community Engagement and Scholarship."

The article examines the convergence of different boundary spanner roles taken up by members of the partnership and the effect of this on the goals of enacting engaged scholarship. Utilizing narrative inquiry, the study highlights community partner voices.
