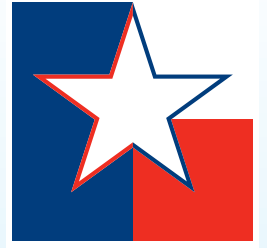

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What is the SECC?

The State Employee Charitable Campaign is the only statutorily-authorized workplace campaign for state agency and higher education employees in Texas. Thanks to legislation that created the SECC in 1993, employees of state agencies, junior and community colleges, universities, and retirees throughout Texas enjoy the benefit of giving to many of their favorite charities through an annual workplace giving campaign which features the convenience of payroll deduction.

State of Texas employees have contributed
\$217 MILLION

through the SECC since its inception in 1993, providing aid to their family, friends, neighbors, and countless others in need across our state.

It's not hard to understand why employees of the Friendship State have responded enthusiastically to the SECC since 1993:

- Our contributions help improve the quality of life for people in communities locally, across the country, and around the world.
- The annual, statewide campaign supports a variety of vital health and human services.
- It's an easy, effective and cost-efficient way to give to charities.
- All charities in the campaign must meet strict eligibility criteria.

How does it work?

Each fall, you get the opportunity to learn about the charities in the SECC, choose which ones you want to help, and then fill out a pledge form to indicate how much you wish to donate to which groups. Your gift can be deducted from each paycheck beginning the next calendar year or you can make a one-time gift.

The campaign runs annually, September through October.

During this time period, you can expect to receive information about this year's SECC charities and a pledge form. This directory provides information on all the charities in the campaign — a great resource not only for helping you make your choices, but also for finding help if you need it yourself.

What charities are involved?

One of the great benefits of the SECC is the wide variety of charities and causes represented; there is something for everyone. They range in scope from small, local grassroots organizations, to well-known national and international groups. All charities that wish to participate must meet stringent legal requirements and then be scrutinized by committees of state employees to ensure:

- They are recognized by the IRS as 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations and registered with the Secretary of State.
- They are audited (or reviewed) by an accountant in accordance with generally-accepted auditing standards.
- They provide direct or indirect health and human services.
- They spend no more than 25 percent of funds raised on administration.

Who governs and runs the SECC?

Committees of state employees govern the SECC at two levels — statewide and locally. They ensure the campaign is conducted fairly and equitably under a strict set of guidelines that give donors confidence in both the charities that benefit and the methods used to solicit.

At the state level ... A committee of state employees called the State Policy Committee (SPC) provides governance and oversight. Three members are appointed by the Governor and three each by the Lieutenant Governor and the Comptroller of Public Accounts. The SPC is responsible for a campaign plan, a budget, and ensuring the eligibility of statewide organizations. The SPC also hires a State Campaign Manager (SCM) to administer the campaign.

At the local level ... Local employee committees (LECs) provide similar oversight. The SPC appoints the LEC chair and committee, which then recommends a local campaign manager (LCM) to the SPC to administer the campaign locally.

How are funds distributed?

Contributions made by state agency employees are distributed by the State Comptroller to participating federations, who then send the funds along to the member agency(ies) that the employee selected. Each university distributes funds to federations through its own payroll system. At the local level, the Local Campaign Managers distribute the funds the same way.

Because it is almost impossible to account for donations lost through such things as an employee leaving or transferring, a percentage method is used to distribute funds. At the end of each year's campaign, the percent of funds pledged to each charity is calculated. Each charity then receives that percentage of what is eventually collected. Undesignated pledges are sent to all participating charities using the same percentage.

Each charity also pays its share of the cost of running the campaign (printed materials, etc.) based on the same percentage.

Why should I give?

- To support a favorite cause or charity on a regular basis.
- To help family, friends, and neighbors in need.
- It's the right thing to do.
- Texans need your help.
- When lots of people give a little, it adds up to a lot!

How much should I give?

How much to give is totally up to you; your personal generosity is no one's business but your own and remains confidential. Still, many of us like to have some idea of what is appropriate to consider as a gift.

FIRST ... Consider giving the average amount of \$337 a year, which is approximately \$25 per month.

SECOND ... Consider one of the giving standards used in campaigns like this throughout the nation — one hour's pay per month.

THIRD ... Consider participating as a leadership giver — one of the many people who like to do a little more by donating at the leadership giving levels described on page 5.

Benefits of payroll deduction

Payroll deduction offers a special opportunity to do more and feel it less.

- You manage your own philanthropy: You know when deductions start, and that you may end them any time.
- It helps to minimize overhead costs while maximizing your contribution.
- It saves time and takes little effort.
- You don't forget to follow through on your pledge.

Best of all...

By donating a specific amount from each paycheck, you can make a more significant impact toward the causes about which you feel passionate.

What will my gift provide?

\$2 per month for one year

- can help connect older adults and families to critical community resources such as rental, utility, and medical assistance.
- puts a book into the hands of 25 children in need.
- provides 72 meals to families and individuals struggling with food insecurity
- provides a care package to a deployed Service Member in need of a morale boost.
- provides trash bags and gloves for 100 volunteers at a community cleanup event.
- provides essential advocacy materials for a child's court case.

\$5 per month for one year

- provides welcome boxes for 10 children newly-diagnosed with pediatric cancer.
- provides a full day of food and shelter for one disaster survivor.
- provides two hours of care services for a neighbor, including help with tasks around the house, personal care, respite, and companionship.
- provides Amber Alert Activation Training for one Law Enforcement Officer
- provides one round of critical puppy vaccinations for one puppy.
- sponsors an evening of fun and connection for adults with Down syndrome, allowing them to spread their wings in the community.

\$10 per month for one year

- supports a guided educational preserve tour for 100 students.
- provides a months' worth of meals to families struggling with food insecurity.
- covers a 90-day supply of over-the-counter medications for children, addressing critical health needs.
- funds a lifeguard for one day to ensure swim safety in an ADA-accessible pool.
- provides six therapy sessions for a client to feel that he has control of a situation or has learned the skills needed to make positive changes in the community.
- funds six disaster cleanup kits for families to begin immediate recovery.

\$20 per month for one year

- provides an accessibility ramp to a home and increase the owner's ability to access their home and the community.
- keeps a family warm in winter by providing utility assistance to the most vulnerable.
- provides diabetes medicine and treatment for 20 children.
- provides clinical services to a homeless individual for one month.
- returns 1,000 oyster shells from a restaurant to the ocean as new oyster reef, with each new oyster filtering and cleaning 50 gallons of water daily.

\$45 per month for one year

- provides 12 sessions of group counseling for a child.
- expands mobile food pantry services, helping to reach more neighborhoods.
- funds the Emergency Medical Technician Program for one student.
- provides quarterly asthma care management visits.
- provides one week of therapy services to a child with a disability or delay.

A case for leadership giving

In the midst of every worthwhile endeavor, there are extraordinary individuals whose caring and personal leadership establish a powerful example for others.

Leadership giving through the State Employee Charitable Campaign provides just such an opportunity for those wishing to maximize the impact of their charitable gift.

An SECC leadership gift will provide far-reaching opportunities for your favorite charitable organizations, enabling them to address a wider range of health and human service issues due to your increased generosity.

If you choose to give \$1,000 or more, please indicate the appropriate giving level on your pledge form and complete the acknowledgement section.

A leadership gift of \$1,000 a year – \$83.34 per month or \$20.83 a week – can provide:

A year of individual therapy sessions for a child who has experienced trauma, ensuring the delivery of consistent and comprehensive support:

OR

Two weeks of therapy services to a child with a disability or delay;

OR

six days of treatment for substance use disorder for a client in need;

OR

12 sessions of group counseling for two children;

OR

34 spay or neuter surgeries;

OR

diagnostic mammograms and ultrasounds for four uninsured women;

OR

two survivors and their children with emergency shelter, meals, and support services for a full week, ensuring their immediate safety;

OR

one day of nurses providing patients and caregivers with clinical trial search navigation and support through Clinical Trial Support Center;

OR

six solar-powered light kits to illuminate a home in an area where electricity is scarce or unreliable;

OR

Cochlear implant programming sessions for six children, ensuring optimal hearing.
