Students may not take either English 131 or English 132 pasì/fail.
Students may take no mor\& than three hours of required American
history paks/fail.
Students may take no more than three hours of required political
science paks/fail.
Students shaf 1 consult with their academic advisors before declaring pass/fail, and obtain signed approval from advisors on the declardtion form.
