## MEETING TO DISCUSS CHARGES TO STUDY COMMITTEES

Attending: Cavazos, Darling, K. Jones, McKown,Richards, Davis, Denham, Newcpmb, Kuethe, Cochran and Sowell

President Cavazos opened the meeting with introductory remarks concerning the importance of the work of the study groups. He stressed that his administration is vifally interested in recommendations of the committees concerning the future of the insfitution and in long-term involvement as the final goals are evolved.

Following this bagkground information, President Cavazos asked for the various committee reports. They are summarized as follows:

Committee A: Chairman Kandi McKown reported that the emphasis of this fommittee has been on teaching quality and improvement as well as evaluation of feaching. A matrix (attached) has been developed delineating the various practichs of the TTU colleges. The committee will then consider this information and have recommendations by the end of the semester.

Committee B: Evelyn Davis, temporary chairman, reported that the commiftee is concerned with the various aspects of research efforts. They have met |with Vice-Presidents Darling and Jones and will meet with Vice-President Bradford in the near future. They expect to have two versions of a questionnaife to distribute by February 1; these will be distributed to department chaifs and others involved with research administration and also to faculty members. President Cavazos offered logistical and organizational support for the committee efforts, and Vice-President Darling suggested using computer assistanch in analyzing the dato with appropriate front-end planning.

Committee D: Clarke Cochran, chairman, reported on the committee stud of student recruitind, counseling and career placement. In view of the $i$ hadequacy of scholarship resources, his committee is investingating various options area at present. Suggested topics for consideration were student rete scheduling in the career planning office. Use of an available report counseling from the Office of Academic Affairs was included in possible for the committee.

Academic Programs: Alice Denham, committee chairman, reported this group's attention has focused on general education requirements, curriculum reyision, and development of new academic programs. Few general requirements are lis catalogue, and the committee is concerned with the balance of the curr need for a broad general education and knowledge of the major subject. President Darling brought out the possible value of the committee's wo identification of procedures for developing new academic programs as w sources of information concerning development of programs. He also stfessed the need to address this issue on the University level.
