I. Announcements

II. Report on Academic Council, May 17 th meeting

(1) In light of statements in the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal, the Senate should urge that candidates have academic backgrounds.
(2) Senator Cartwight recalled that the previous selection called for a medical sch col dean and asked if the same requirements apply in this selection.
(3) Senator Whitsitt asked that qualifications be stated to urge academic as opposed to professional background.
(4) Senator Howe asked that faculty members be allowed to nominate individuals.
(5) Senator Ketne moved that all voting faculty members be asked for their suggestions for presidential qualifications with a special separate mailing. The motion passed.

Senator Wilson str\&ssed that these comments be conveyed to the search Committee.

(1) The Board of kegents shall name a Selection Committee, which shalp be comprised of two subcommittees, a Search Committee and an Advisory Committee. The Search Committee shall be composed of four Regents, two Texas Tech University faculty members and one Texas Tech University He ith Sciences Center faculty member [and-three-facaity members]. The Advisory Committee shall be composed of four [Evo] Regents, two fexas Tech University students, one Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center student, two Texas Tech University fotmer students, one Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center former student, and one faculty member from each independently organized college and school of Texas Tech University and Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center [eight-faerity-members-inełuding-one-from-each cołłege-and-tyo-from-Fexas-Tech-University-Heałth-Seiences-Genter].
(A) The Search Committee shall receive, review, and screen all applications and either accept or reject the candidates. It will prepare final list of candidates, who will be interviewed by the Seleqtion Committee, prior to an interview by the Board of Regents.
(B) The Advisory Committee shall evaluate each candidate, using criteria established by the Board of Regents as guidelines.
(2) The Board of Hegents shalf determine the criteria to be considered in selecting a new President.
(3) The Board of fegents shall select a President.
