ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The BFA in Dance with a concentration in Performance and Choreography prepares students to become independent creative artists by providing the skills, tools, and practice necessary to pursue a career in professional dance. Our faculty provide conservatory-style technical training where students take artistic risks, expand skills, think critically, and pursue an interdisciplinary, collaborative approach as dancers, choreographers, directors, performers, writers, and/or teachers.

This new degree program offers students multiple opportunities to perform and create work – in concerts, guest artists' choreography showcases, student and faculty concerts, and more. Our new, state-of-the-art facilities, which include multiple studios equipped with media for presentation and performance, inspire students to develop their artistry with invited guest artists featured in intensive programs unique to Texas Tech University. Through our multi-faceted approach to learning, graduates of Texas Tech University's BFA in Dance degree will bring exceptional technical training and developed artistic perspective to whichever paths they choose.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

To be considered for admission into the BFA Dance degree program, prospective students must submit an online application to Texas Tech through ApplyTexas and audition for the program.

- Before auditioning*, applicants must register online with Acceptd (<https://app.getacceptd.com/ttutd>), which will require uploading your resume, headshot and a writing sample. (\$30 application fee applies.)
- To attend the on-campus audition held **Saturday, February 13, 2021**, you must complete and submit your Acceptd application by **Friday, February 5, 2021**.

BA vs BFA: WHICH IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

Texas Tech's School of Theatre & Dance offers two undergraduate degrees in Dance: Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA).
