

# The STEP Learning Assistant Program: Students Supporting Students

## Introduction

The STEP Program facilitates faculty-student partnerships to create classroom communities that enhance student learning. While the impact of LAs on enrolled students is well-known, how LAs are affected is less known. We are engaged in four, ongoing, complementary research projects aimed at understanding the impact of the STEP Learning Assistant (LA) Program, on the Learning Assistants. Projects include evaluating effects of the LA program on student motivation, perception of teaching, desire to teach, and trends between pedagogical training and career goals. Another project is aimed at developing an LA-centered database through which future research can be supported and conducted.

2. **Analyze Pedagogical Training and Career Aspirations:** Explore links between pedagogical training and career aspirations of LAs.
3. **Develop a Comprehensive LA Database:** Build a database to facilitate future research on LA outcomes.
