Connecting Past and Present: The Old Canaan Cemetery Bioarchaeology Project

Introduction

The Old Canaan Cemetery Bioarchaeology Project began in 2018 at the request of the Canaan Missionary Baptist Church community located in Marshall, Texas. The community established a church and cemetery in approximately 1870. Due to Jim Crow-era violence and intimidation, the church was relocated about one mile from the cemetery in 1938. In 2018, the church community contacted the Texas Historical Commission to inquire about archaeological documentation of the cemetery and the THC connected them with Texas Tech. Our goal is to collaborate with the church community to provide answers to their questions about the cemetery size and who is buried there using archaeological, bioarchaeological, and historical data.
