I. STATEMENT OF GOALS

II. RESEARCH TOPIC INTEREST

Provide **THREE** research topics of interest. Prior to applying, scholars are welcome, but not required to work with faculty mentors who can offer a project in a specific area of interest. If no pre-arranged pairing is indicated, the review committee will make every effort to accommodate scholar research interest in the scholar-mentor pairing decision. The committee cannot guarantee scholars will be paired to work on a project in your research interest.

 - Publications: If you have had previous research experience and have published the findings, please provide the relevant citations. Note: most applicants will not have research publications
 - Personal Interests and Achievements: Activities, hobbies, clubs, and organizations

References:** Please ask two individuals familiar with your research potential, educational background, current professors, or future professional inspiration (i.e. previous veterinarian employers) to submit letters of reference to Dr. Annelise Nguyen (address below). References may include faculty members from your undergraduate program, scientists, and/or other supervisors/employers. Please provide the names of your references in the spaces below. In the letter of reference, please address the following topics:
 - Referee's general role in interactions with the applicant.
 - How long the referee has known the applicant.
 - Place the applicant into a general peer group and rate the applicant against that group.

- The applicant's strengths, weaknesses, and potential as a veterinary researcher.
- Why the applicant would be a participant of the Veterinary Research Scholars Program.
